#### **Diggers & Dealers Mining Forum**

Minviro's Phoebe Whattoff, Country Director, Australia, blogs for us on her experience and Diggers and Dealers earlier this month

As I reflect on my experience at the 2024 Diggers & Dealers Mining Forum, one word stands out: gold. This year, the forum was truly focused on the gold industry, with discussions, presentations, and networking opportunities all highlighting the metal's significance in today's mining landscape.

Held in Kalgoorlie, Western Australia, the forum brought together industry leaders, investors, and professionals from around the world. The focus on the gold sector was particularly strong, reflecting the ongoing global demand for gold and its role in maintaining economic stability, especially amid market fluctuations.

Monday's stock market wipeout made for plenty of chatter at the forum on Tuesday. There are questions about how serious the downturn is and what it spells for those also starting to feel the pinch from softer commodity prices.

Although companies representing the critical minerals space were few and far between, they did not disappoint with their insightful presentations. Examples include Australia Strategic Minerals making significant strides in securing >A\$1bn funding in conditional debt funding for the Dubbo Project, and a letter of interest for A\$49M from US EXIM. Chalice Mining presented their Gonneville PGE-Ni-Cu-Co project and the recent announcement of their signed MOU with Mitsubishi Corporation with the intention to formalise a potential binding partnership post the PFS completion. The newly appointed CEO of Core Lithium, Paul Brown, presented on the team's current focus. They are working on optimizing the currently paused Finniss Lithium Operation. This is being achieved by conducting a bottom-up cost analysis of the past 18 months of operational data. The goal is to reduce overall operating costs while ensuring that the processing facility remains operationally sound. This will prepare the facility to recommence operations when the lithium price increases.

Networking is always a key feature of Diggers & Dealers. I had the opportunity to engage with some of the most innovative minds in the industry. These conversations not only reinforced the importance of Australia's raw materials feeding the global economy but also showcased the cutting-edge approaches companies are taking to ensure the sector's sustainability. The collective commitment to environmental stewardship and responsible mining practices was evident, and it's encouraging to see the industry moving in this direction.

The forum provided a rich platform for meaningful discussions, knowledge exchange, and the formation of new partnerships. As we navigate the challenges and possibilities ahead, it's clear that the drive for governmental support, staying competitive with product prices and maintaining high ESG credentials will play a pivotal role in shaping the future of mining both in Australia and globally. I am excited to be part of this journey and to contribute to the ongoing success and sustainability of the sector as a whole.

This nickel cost analysis comes at a time when demand for nickel continues to rise, largely owing to its use within lithium-ion batteries to power electric vehicles (EVs). Batteries accounted for 15% of primary nickel demand in 2023 (up from just 4% in 2017), though the market is still dominated by the stainless steel sector.
